¹ These classes are graduation requirements and are suggested for sophomores.

(The classes can be taken during the junior or senior year. Biology can be taken by freshmen as long as they meet the necessary pre-requisites.)

* Science classes are recommended for juniors, but are not required.

** Math in the 11th grade is highly recommended but not required.

*** Students are required to take at least two credits of math during their last year of high school.

Admission Standards For Idaho Colleges

As students develop their 4-year plans, they should keep their post high school plans in mind. Here are the minimum standards for admission to Idaho's colleges and universities. Other colleges, especially out-of-state schools, may have other requirements. Students should check with the specific institution they plan to attend.

REQUIREMENTS:

- **ENGLISH - 4 Years**

- **MATH - 3 Years**

Four years are strongly recommended. Math credits may come from the following courses: Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, Trigonometry, Pre-Calculus, Calculus, Informal Geometry, Discrete Math and Data Analysis or AP Statistics.

- **HUMANITIES/FOREIGN LANGUAGE - 1 Year**

Credits may come from: Foreign Language, Fine Arts, some social studies classes and other subject areas.

- **SOCIAL SCIENCES - 3 Years - Credits must include U.S. History, U.S. Government and Economics.**

- **NATURAL SCIENCES - 3 Years - Courses may include Biology, Zoology, Human Anatomy & Physiology, Human Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Earth Science, Space Science and Botany, Ecology, Environmental Science, Field Research, and Horticulture. At least 2 credits must involve a laboratory science.**

- **ELECTIVES**

Speech or Debate; Studio/Performing Arts; Advanced Foreign Language study; most Professional-Technical courses.

- **OTHER**

Graduate from an accredited Idaho high school and submit scores from the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) or the American College Test (ACT).
