Bond Election - Patrons will go to the polls on Tuesday, May 18, to vote on a \$57.5 million bond to pay for critical upgrades to school buildings. Polls will be open 8 am to 8 pm at all the district's elementary schools, Idaho Falls High School and Skyline High School. Eligible voters can cast ballots at any polling place. Patrons who are not registered to vote can register at the polls with photo ID and proof of residency such as a utility bill. Kindergarten Schedule - The Idaho Falls School Board has decided not to make any changes to its kindergarten schedule for the 2010-2011 school year. The board was considering an all-day, every other day schedule and the elimination of mid-day bussing, which would have saved the district more than \$100,000. The board may consider changes for the 2011-2012 school year.

PowerSchool – There is a new function in PowerSchool for demographic changes such as address, telephone, and emergency contacts. To access, log into PowerSchool and click on Demographics Update icon at the top. Make appropriate changes, check box at the bottom of screen, and then submit. The school secretary will then confirm the changes and update PowerSchool.

Family Picnic - Our annual Family Picnic is scheduled for Wednesday, June 2. Please bring your lunch and enjoy eating with your child(ren). Notification of Asbestos Containing Material
Per the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act

April 28, 2010

Idaho Falls School District 91 is required by 40 CFR Part 763, the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), to “ensure that workers and building occupants, organizations, or parent teacher organizations, are informed at least once each school year about inspections, response actions, and post response actions activities, including periodic reinspections and surveillance activities that are planned or are in progress.”

The following District 91 buildings contain known or suspected asbestos containing materials: A.H. Bush Elementary; Dora Erickson Elementary; Edgemont Gardens Elementary; Emerson Elementary; Ethel Boyes Elementary; Hawthorne Elementary; Linden Park Elementary; Longfellow Elementary; Temple View Elementary; Westside Elementary; Theresa Bunker Elementary; Clair E. Gale Jr. High; Eagle Rock Jr. High; Idaho Falls High Complex; Skyline High; Emerson High, Relocatable Modular Classrooms E1-E2, A1-A2, H1-H2, J, C1-C2; Administration Office; Maintenance and Operations Building; Administration Annex; Warehouse; New Sweden Storage; York Storage and Food Services.

Each of above named buildings has an Asbestos Management Plan (AMP) that is available for review. The AMP is located in the Head Custodian’s office for each school or RMC, in the Superintendents’ office for the Administration Building, in the Warehouse Office for the District Warehouse, and in the office of the Environmental, Safety & Health Engineer for the remaining buildings. The Maintenance and Operations Plan, Section VII of the Asbestos Management Plan, describes how ACM is contained and maintained to ensure the environment in each building is kept safe.

Asbestos surveillances are performed every six months by head custodians and/or trained asbestos inspectors. The three year reinspections are ongoing, with a portion of the district buildings done each year. These inspections are conducted by accredited School District 91 and/or contractor personnel.

This summer, asbestos abatement projects are planned for Clair E. Gale Junior High. The abatement and monitoring for these projects will be conducted by accredited and/or licensed personnel who are independent of Idaho Falls School District 91, as mandated by federal regulations.
